The philosophy teaches nonviolence, love, compassion and reverence for all life.





Basic Steps to Peaceful Conflict Management


- 1. Calm the children
- 2. Acknowledge children's feelings.
- 3. When the children are calm, gather information.
- 4. Restate the problem clearly and non-judgmentally.
- 5. The children brainstorm ideas about how to resolve the conflict. Choose a solution together.
- 6. Try the idea (take action) and evaluate.


2) Each child will express comfort and joy with human diversity; accurate language for human differences, and deep, caring human connections.





3) Each child will increasingly recognize unfairness, have language to describe unfairness, and understand that unfairness hurts.



4) Each child will demonstrate empowerment and the skills to act, with others or alone, against prejudice and/or discriminatory actions.













He wasn't a chief. He was a "leader in time of crisis"

He was a member of the coastal Duwamish & Suquamish tribes from the Puget Sound area by Seattle, Washington.


His people fished from canoes and gathered in long houses.

They did not wear feather headdresses, leather fringed clothing, live in tipis or ride horses.







Witness to Bullying Behavior

- Witnesses to peer bullying have concerns that often keep them from intervening.
 - Personal safety
 - Their standing in the peer group



From Witness to Ally

- •Witness or Ally?
- Empathy, self-esteem & connection
- Developing ability to observe and access a situation



Becoming and Ally

- Adults must support all children when they intervene
- Adults must role model advocacy skills
- Children need to be encouraged to practice advocacy and conflict resolution skills until these skills become internalized.








